





2. Where do you ride your bike?














7. What is your general position on dedicated bike lanes on city streets? Choices given: Fully support, support in some locations, oppose.








9. What is your biggest concern with dedicated bike lanes?










16. Do you feel that bicycles, like cars, should 'register' as a road user and pay an annual fee?
